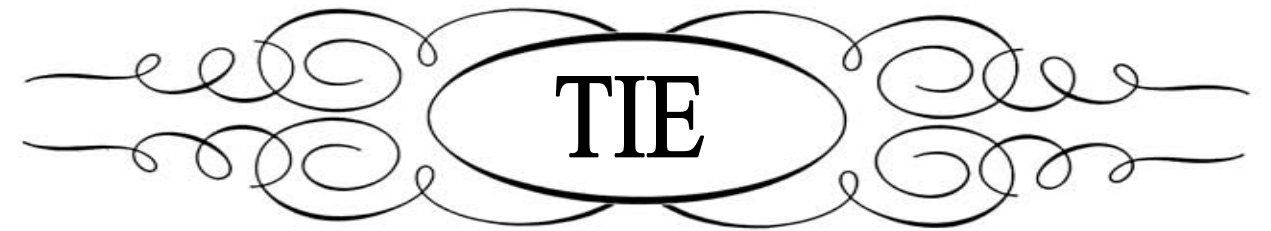

There's a lot of worrying going around! We worry about important things and unimportant things. We worry about things we can do something about, and things we can't do anything about. Worrying seldom leads to anything positive. One of the

main problems with the average worrier is the inability to make decisions. Being indecisive increases stress, gives us an additional problem about which to worry, and leaves us ill-equipped to face the normal living of the day. With this in mind, I offer some "do's" and "don'ts" about decision-making.

1. Don't make a decision in anger. Wait until your anger has subsided, your mind has cleared, and your emotional make-up is back to normal. Anger will often distort your perspective. It was in anger that Esau decided to kill his brother Jacob, though later they were reconciled.

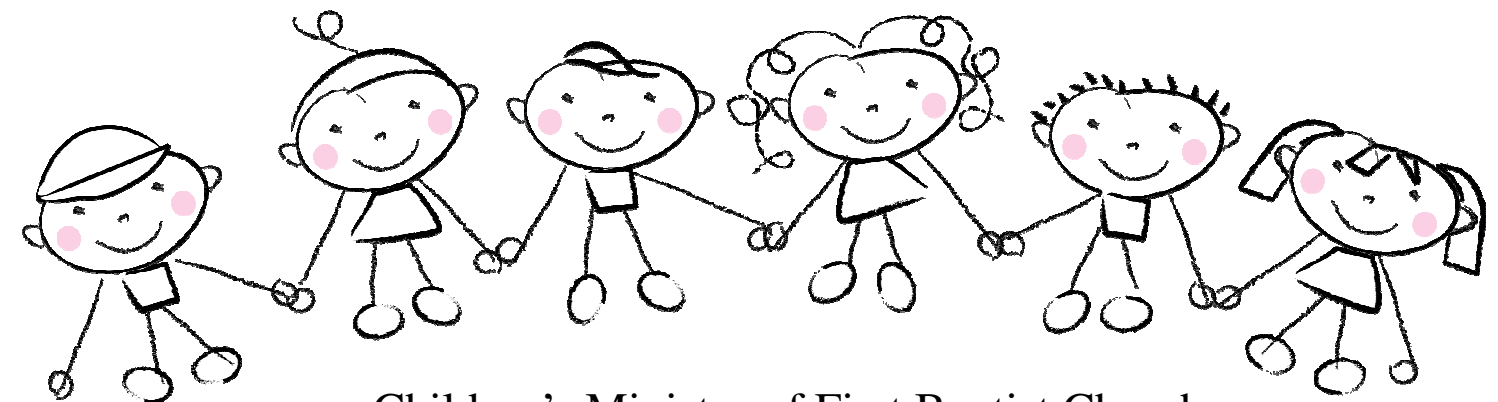
2. Don't make a decision when discouraged or fatigued. Again, when you are emotionally or physically under par, you are more capable of poor judgment and faulty reasoning. Being discouraged makes it hard to see the positive and the bright side. When the prophet Jeremiah was discouraged, he tried to quit preaching.

3. Don't make a decision when overenthusiastic. When things go well, it's tempting to think that doing great things is easy. But it often happens that the person who says "yes" in times of encouragement is the same one who gives up in times of discouragement. The easily enthused person often forgets to count the costs of his decision.

4. When making a decision, think of the consequences. Can I live with my decision? Am I willing to accept the results of my decision? Would I be willing to make the same decision again, given the circumstances?

5. Make a decision with your priorities in mind. Your decision will never please everyone; that's not the point of making a decision anyway. The important thing is that first, it pleases God, that it serves others, and that it leaves you without regret.

You blessed Peggy and I in so many ways during the Christmas season with your cards, gifts, prayers, and words of encouragement. Thank you for being our church family.

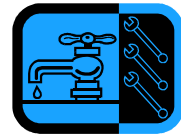

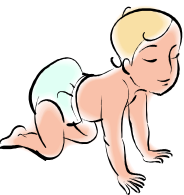

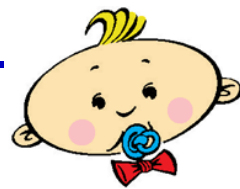


Heartfelt sympathy goes out to Sandy Whitesides and family in the death of his father, **Bob Whitesides**, on December 12, 2013.

## Winter Family Fun From Early Years

When you look back on your childhood, a few favorite memories probably stand out. Consider one of these ideas for making new memories with your child.

### Family Journal

Learn about family members' days by keeping a shared journal. Once or twice a week after dinner, pass around a notebook, and have each person write a sentence or two about something funny or interesting that happened recently. (If your youngster isn't writing yet, let him tell you what to write on his turn.) On the last day of each month, relive memories by reading the journal together.

### Old Fashioned Games

Introduce your child to traditional games like marbles, jacks, and croquet. You might ask older relatives to teach you their favorites, or get a book like *The Games Book: How to Play the Games of Yesterday* (Scholastic).

### New Places

Look for places your family has never been before. You could try a hobby shop, fire station, or different playground. Let your youngster keep a list of the places they like best so you can visit them again.

### Weekend "Campouts"

One weekend a month, hold a family campout. It can be indoors when it's cold out and in your backyard during the warmer weather. Set up a tent, or drape a sheet over some chairs for a makeshift fort. Then, put sleeping bags and pillows inside, and snuggle up to tell stories.

Hello Courtney!

I hope you and your family are doing well!! Thanks so much to you and your church community for your donations this year to the women's ministry medical fund. It has made a HUGE difference within our community. Thanks to your gift earlier this year, we were able to send a sexual assault victim from the DRC to the hospital for medical and psychological treatment that she DESPERATELY needed. She was attacked and tortured in September of 2012 in the DRC by rebel soldiers. She experienced complex medical complications and PTSD as a result of this attack. For a year she experienced physical and psychological suffering. Her husband died around the same time, leaving her a single parent of her six children. Unfortunately, she remained unable to freely move and went long periods without speaking. Her children went through a very difficult time with the trauma of the attack their family experienced and seeing their mom continue to suffer. They felt helpless.

As a result of the medical care, their mother has healed a lot physically and emotionally. She is now able to speak and is able to move more freely ( she has even started walking again). Her recovery was really amazing and could not have taken place without you all! From the bottom of my heart, thank you!!!

This medical care has given this family renewed hope. They are Christians. When I visited the mom after she got back from the hospital, she sang songs of praises and talked about God for over an hour!!! Just a few weeks before, she was not even able to speak! She saw the love and hope of God through this action. She noted that it was God's miracle to bring hope, restoration and healing to her life and the lives of her children. Thank you for sharing the love and hope of Christ with this family!!

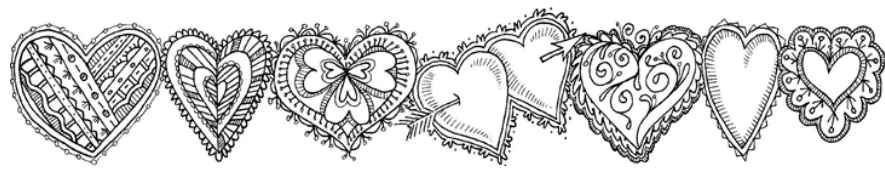

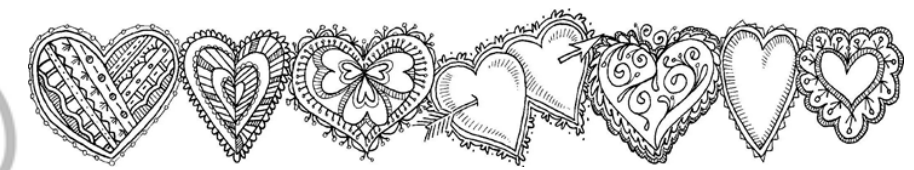
