Keith Parks, who was for many years President of the Foreign Mission Board, and one of the most humble, dedicated Christians I have ever met, told a story about his first pastorate. He was 23 years old, and the church was in Redsprings, Texas. They decided to have a revival, and Keith was asked to preach. In one of the first services, he preached on one of the Beatitudes. “Blessed are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness, for they shall be filled.” As he was trying to share what the verse meant, he was suddenly overwhelmed with its truth and power. He said it nearly “blew him over” to realize that God was saying “if you really want me, I will fill you as full of Myself as you want to be filled.”

What an offer! What a promise! And what a challenge as we make our way through the season of Lent. Lent is a time well-spent in self-examination. It’s a time for honesty. How much of Christ do we really want in our lives? How much of our lives are we willing to give over to His control? It is quite a shock to realize that Christ is willing to give each of us as much of Himself as we want.

If Christ is filling us with His Spirit and presence and power, then there will be a noticeable difference between our lives and the lives of those who aren't experiencing Christ in this way. There will be a difference in our family relationships, our neighborhood and community relationships, our work and school relationships. If you and I would be willing to say, “Lord fill me with Yourself,” then you and I would be changed, our church would be changed, and our ministry would know no limits.

Make good use of the days and weeks of Lent. It is clear what Christ has done for us. Now, what are we willing to do for Him?

Another week of WATTS ministry has come and gone. And once again, you provided warmth and care for our homeless guests. So many volunteers, food, hospitality, financial donations, and so many prayers. Special thanks to our lead volunteers: Abbye Gordon, Bill Headley, Rik Pell, and Mattie Fries. And I’m especially grateful that through ministries such as our Fellowship Fund and other community ministries, that we can continue to help many of the homeless throughout the year. God bless each of you who have a part in this ministry.

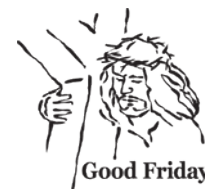
Palm Sunday Covered Dish Luncheon

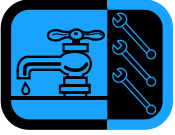
