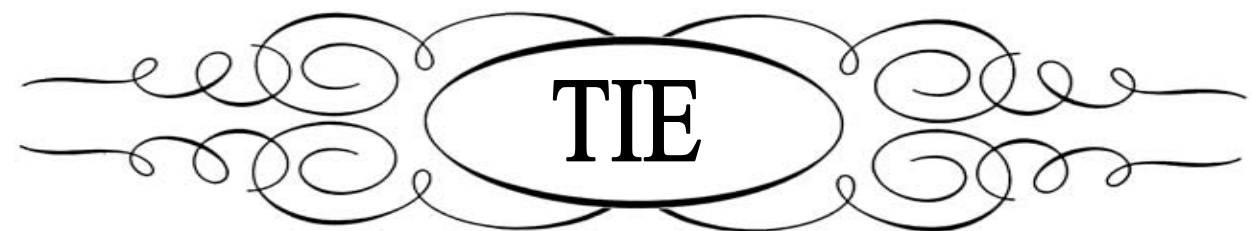

There is a Bible Study entitled, "Called to Ministry." The question is asked, "What do we mean by the word, ministry?" The following definition is given, "Ministry describes any and all activity of the church or individuals intended to have a helping or redeeming effect on other persons. The model for ministry is God's love revealed in Jesus Christ."

According to this definition, how much of what we do at First Baptist Church can be viewed as "ministry?" Do we say what we say, do we do what we do, with the intention of helping and redeeming people? Anyone can help another person, but for us as Christians, the motive for our helping must be to share the love of God as it is revealed in Jesus Christ.

With that in mind, as we near the beginning of summer, we are presented with several opportunities for "ministry." Passport Kids takes place on June 18-21 for our schoolagers at Eagle Eyrie. It is a chance for our children to be involved in missions, both learning about and carrying out missions. Youth Passport is July 7-12. Our young people and their adult leaders will be going to Danville, Va., to participate in a wide variety of ministries in that community. Our youth will be able to do hands-on ministry as well as explore possible future ministry options. July 14-18 is Vacation Bible School. Inviting people to be a part of this special week is a ministry. Bringing them to VBS is a ministry. Being a part of the VBS staff is a ministry. Lots of ways for you to be involved.

Later, on September 21-26, we will take a Construction Mission Trip to Nada, Kentucky. Our goal will be to complete projects that were started during the summer by other church groups. It is always a blessing to work with the families in Nada.

I also mention other opportunities, including the Schoolage Retreat on May 23-24, "Mission: Possible" on June 21<sup>st</sup>, when the youth will involve themselves in several ministries in our community on the same day, and one that recently took place, when Women on Mission prepared and served a meal at the Salvation Army Shelter.

And if you can't physically participate in any of these ministries, you can offer the ministry of prayer. You can pray for these and other ministries anywhere and anytime.

I invite you to spend the next few months "helping and redeeming people, modeling the love of God revealed in Jesus Christ."

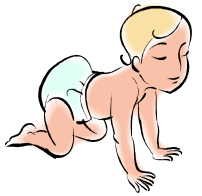

# A Little TLC from the SLC

This is part two in a series of really great character building values to teach youngsters. It takes patience and practice to teach good character to your child. These tips and ideas can help you encourage respect, kindness, honesty, and other important traits.

## CHARACTER BUILDERS

From Early Years

### HONESTY

☀️Take turns thinking of examples of honesty, such as returning money someone dropped or not bragging to a friend that you can ride a two-wheeler if you really can't. Your child will learn more about being honest as you talk.

☀️Encourage honesty by making your youngster feel safe telling the truth. When he/she owns up to a mistake, like taking your keys to play with them, thank your child for being honest. Together, discuss what she could do next time (ask to play with the keys).

☀️Teach your child to make honest compliments. If your child is writing a thank you note for a gift she doesn't like, for instance, help your child think of something nice to say without lying ("this shirt has my favorite cartoon character on it").

### EMPATHY

☀️Here's a way for your child to practice recognizing others' emotions. Take turns making faces at each other. You might say, "Show me your surprised face." After your child makes the face, he/she could ask you to do one ("show me your sad face").

☀️Name something that people in your family feel differently about (say, bugs). Let each person describe how they feel. You'll help your youngster understand that people may have different feelings than they do. Example: "I like spiders, but they bother Mommy."

☀️What can your child do if someone is upset, angry, or afraid? Encourage him/her to consider responses to people's feelings. You might say, "Trevor looks unhappy. Maybe playing a game with you would cheer him up."

Dear Family and Friends,

I hope everyone has had an eventful year and is looking forward to a relaxing summer. My first year at Virginia Tech has been fantastic. I can't believe how quickly these two semesters have gone. I am sad my freshman year is coming to an end, but I am looking forward to the next three years at VT. I am especially excited for this summer, which is why I am writing this letter to you. You all have had an impact in my life, and I want to share a special opportunity I have for this summer with you.

While in Winchester, I was involved in my youth group at First Baptist Church. Over the past year at school, I have become involved in the Baptist Collegiate Ministries (BCM). The BCM has had a great impact on my life and my faith. I have met many people and formed friendships through this ministry. I am fortunate to have had opportunities which allowed me to be involved in community. I have done several community service events that have been about giving back to the community and this campus. These events and my experiences with FBC and the BCM have changed my life, and I knew I wanted to do something more.

Over the past year, I have heard many stories from my cousin Tyler about the summer internship he did with an organization called Church Hill Activities and Tutoring (CHAT). CHAT is a community development organization located in Church Hill, a neighborhood located outside of Richmond, VA. It is Christian based and is devoted to working with and forming relationships with the inner city youth. CHAT has several programs such as after school tutoring, life skills classes, youth groups, summer camps, and even an academy for high school students. The families that work with CHAT open up their homes to these kids, who most of the time come from single-parent households and a high exposure to violence, drugs, abuse, and crime at young ages. The goal of CHAT is to build relationships with the youth of the neighborhood based off its three core values of faith, hope, and love. 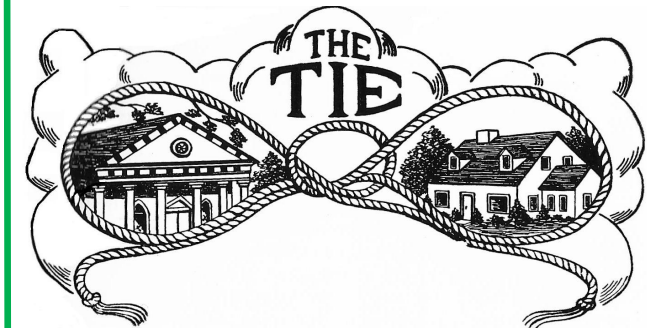
