




Many years ago Jerry Willis of Navarre, Florida, along with two of his friends, spent five days adrift in the Atlantic Ocean. They were on a small, inflatable, rubber raft. The three men feel they

have a shark to thank for their rescue.


The men were asleep when a shark bumped the raft and awakened them. They tried to fight off the shark with the only weapon they had—a four-inch pocketknife. The commotion in the raft caused them to be spotted by a seaman on a passing freighter. They were quickly rescued. Willis said afterward, "If the shark hadn't attacked, we would never have been seen by the men on the freighter."

Many times in life we face crisis situations—events that create fear and anxiety. Several of you have recently faced, or are in the midst of, such a situation. Those crises can cause our faith to be shaken or even shattered. But on the other hand, crises can increase our faith, it can lead us to faith.

God has the power to help us. He can be trusted with whatever life brings. God can even turn bad situations to good account. He can use means that would not occur to us. He calls each of us to place our faith and trust in Him.

Vacation Bible School is always a special week in the life of our church. This year's VBS is from July 14-18, beginning at 5:00 PM with a light dinner and concluding each night at 8:00 PM. The theme this year is "Weird Animals." From the VBS material—"Kids love crazy, weird animals... the weirder the better. all, I suppose a good place to start is the beginning! Since February, 2013 I have been battling with many different medical issues while I attended my spring semester at Johnson University in Knoxville, TN. Throughout this time, we struggled to determine a diagnosis as symptoms kept throwing doctors off and leaving them scratching their heads. Finally, the week of May 13, 2013. I was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia. This really rocked my world, but I know God is going to do good things through this. This is my story and a documentation of my journey through this next part of my life.

I write today with some mixed emotions. At my most recent appointment, my doctor informed me that I am slowly losing my transplant. That means that the percentage of my blood that is me is increasing while the percentage that is of my dad's is decreasing. The marrow is not grafting in. This being said, we are at a point of 'wait and see'. We will continue to monitor what my body does and we will decide a plan of action as we go. This is somewhat concerning because any percentage of my blood that is genetically from me could return as cancer. I am not too worried about this because frankly worrying will not change a thing. If the cancer comes back, then I may be slightly more dismayed. Right now, I am celebrating that I have been cleared to drive and play softball, as well as many other things! Getting more freedom is wonderful and I hope to continue in the right direction. Despite the fact that I am losing the transplant, it is still a real possibility that the cancer will never come back. Right now, we will wait and see what happens!

God has it under control!


Summer Book Club

The "Word" is moving!!






