About a month ago I preached a sermon on the Good Samaritan. Jesus talked about what it means to be a <u>neighbor</u>. He said what mattered was not, <u>who</u> is my neighbor, but rather the importance of <u>being</u> a neighbor. We are to be neighbors to anyone who needs us.

This past Sunday I preached a sermon on our <u>motives</u> for doing the things we do. Jesus used examples of giving, praying, and fasting to say that we can do good things for not so good reasons. We can act out of mixed motives.

I thought of both of these sermons when I saw this article entitled, "A Modern Rendering of the Good Samaritan."

"A certain chronic absentee, in the course of his drifting away from the church, fell among bad companions who robbed him of his interest in spiritual things and left him wounded in heart and soul.

And by chance, there came to the absentee's door a certain perfunctory visitor, caring only to boost the attendance of his class. So when the visitor heard the words, 'Please leave me alone,' he passed by, never to visit that place again.

And likewise there came to the absentee's door a duty-driven visitor, coming only to carry out an assignment. But when he got no answer to the ringing doorbell, he wrote 'not at home' across the visitor's card and proclaimed he had fulfilled his responsibility.

But a certain concerned Christian with a compassionate heart came to the absentee's door. In spite of the cold reception he returned again and again. He kept on visiting even when the absentee said, 'Please leave me alone.' Aloud he said, 'I'll come by for you on Sunday morning and take you to church.' And to himself he added, 'And whatever else it will take. I'll do for Jesus' sake.'

And lo, the chronic absentee began to be interested and finally was won over to Christ. And, the love in the heart of the concerned Christian kept growing until it included <u>all</u> his 'neighbors.'"

This "modern parable" reminds us that sometimes we are a neighbor and sometimes we're not; that sometimes our motives are worthy and sometimes they're not. Ask God to help you find ways to <u>be</u> a neighbor, and to make your motives <u>pure</u>, for His honor and glory.

Thanks to everyone who made our Vacation Bible School a wonderful success. Special thanks to Sherry Headley for all her efforts as our Director, for her committee, and for everyone who was a part of the VBS staff. Our theme was "Kingdom Rock" and we learned how to "Stand Strong for God." It was a great week, and God blessed us in many, many ways.



Ministry and Motherhood


This book of essays compiled and presented by Alicia Davis Porterfield includes an essay written by our own **Pastor Kristin Whitesides**. Each essay in this inspiring collection is as different as the mother-minister who wrote it, from theologians to chaplains, inner-city ministers to rural-poverty ministers, youth pastors to preachers, mothers who have adopted, birthed, and done both.

The "duet" of calls—to follow God and to become a mother—began with Sarah's story in Genesis and continues in God's people today. As more women follow God's call into ministry, many are

discovering the power of this duet. These women are gifted for ministry, trained and shaped through excellent educations, and affirmed in their call. They serve as pastors in churches, on campuses, in impoverished areas, prisons, hospitals, hospices, the military, and in academia. And many of them are also called to be mothers: birth mothers, adoptive mothers, mothers to other people's children, mothers to their students. As they continue to follow God, the call story and the birth story combine, and the duet rings true.


